Region 2 Student of the Year

Congratulations to Michele Birmingham, a second year Early Childhood Education (ECHE) student from Katahdin High School, for being named the Region Two 2015 "Student of the Year". Michele will graduate with twelve college credits, her CECA state certification and an acceptance to the ECHE program at EMCC for the fall, with plans to continue her education at UMF for a Bachelor's Degree in ECHE.

Bridges Program 2015-16

Last Thursday, twelve RSU 50 students were interviewed for the Bridges program which will begin in the Fall of 2015. Students selected for the Bridges program will have the opportunity to earn over 30 college credits during their Junior and Senior years. Students selected for the Bridge Year Program will be required to attend a seminar at the University of Maine for three days. During those three days, students will engage in team-building activities, explore college and career pathways, tour colleges and businesses, and also register as a college student for the upcoming school year.

Bridges courses will be taught by RSU 50 teachers while working with University of Maine and University of Maine-Augusta professors. These course will serve as dual enrollment courses, with students earning a high school credit and also three college course credits for each course completed. Teachers and administrators will be attending an all day training on April 29th at the University of Maine.

Spring Testing

All juniors will be taking the SAT on Wednesday April 15th. Both KMHS and SACS students will be testing. Smarter Balance Testing has begun for Grade 7 & 8 students. Testing for Grade 11 students will begin following the April Break.

Rural U Courses

Next school year, students will have the opportunity to take college courses with RSU 50 teachers. Six teachers in RSU 50 have been approved to teach these courses. The University of Maine at Fort Kent professors will be working with our teachers to ensure the curriculum and courses are aligned to their course requirements. Students who successfully complete a Rural U course will receive dual credit, a high school credit and three college credits. 

Last Day of School

The last day of school will be Wednesday, June 17, 2015. Students will have a half day and staff will have a full day. We will share end of the year activities at the May meeting.

Region II - "Student of the Year"

Region II has announced that Michelle Birmingham, a second year Early Childhood Education (ECHE) student from Katahdin High School, is the Region II 2015 "Student of the Year". Michelle will graduate with 12 college credits, her CECA state certification and an acceptance to the ECHE program at EMCC this fall. (Principal Porter will provide more information)

Smarter Balance Testing

Students have begun the Smarter Balance Testing. Principals will provide an update.

Cooperative Hockey

Principal Porter has been approached by parents requesting that RSU 50 explore the possibility of a cooperative sport in high school hockey with Houlton/Hodgdon. Board action, in the affirmative, would support the exploration of this cooperative sport. The board would have to vote again (as well as both Houlton and Hodgdon) in the affirmative in May to allow this to happen. Principal Porter will provide costs to the RSU to participate.

Maine DOE Site Visit - Extension 5 / Proficiency Diploma

The Maine DOE is scheduled to visit on May 27, 2015, from 9 am to 1 pm to follow-up on our extension request of meeting the requirement to fully implement proficiency-based diplomas by 2018. The purpose of their visit is to review progress the SAU has made since submitting the extension request, to clarify goals as needed, and to support the SAU in planning next steps.

The visiting team will consist of two to four members, including, whenever possible, the regional representative for the Superintendents' region. In addition the team may include other members of the Standards and Instructional Support Team, the Assessment and Accountability Team, the Special Services Team or School Improvement Specialists.

This visit will include discussions with the district proficiency-based leadership team, the high school leadership team and high school teachers. (See Handout)

Coordinator of Academic Achievement and Professional Learning

Budget - This is a new position to RSU 50. We have budgeted \$60,000 and will negotiate the days and salary based on experience. Our needs is this area are increasing and we have assessed other areas for reduction and have shifted costs based on those needs. Rationale - RSU 50 exists for the purpose of educating our children and youth and helping them become successful contributors to society. Since we are a learning organization, an emphasis needs to be placed on ensuring that the curricula (the 'what' students learn) as well as the pedagogy (the 'how' students learn) and the purpose (the 'why' students learn what the they do and the way they learn it) is not dependent upon the particular teachers, school, or 'side' of the district. Schools today more than ever demand that curricula be addressed in systemic ways, that they adhere to 21st century expectations and meet mandates/requirements. Ultimately, we wish to set our students up for success no matter what they choose to pursue beyond high school graduation. With changing curricula and assessment needs, mandates, and accountability systems in place. districts need someone at the helm whose sole responsibility is to ensure that our students come into contact with excellent curricula, taught through best practices, and assessed with credibility and validity. Teachers and principals cannot continue to try to coordinate these large-scale efforts themselves, although they have done valiant efforts thus far in doing so. With requirements to align curricula to the new Maine Parameters of Learning (Maine Learning Results), prepare for the new Maine MEA, graduate students with proficiency diplomas, and assess our teachers' performance partially on the basis of student growth assessments, a curriculum coordinator is no longer a luxury but rather a necessity.

Bridges Program Update

Plans are underway to host a "Bridges Program" in RSU 50 next fall. The first cohort is for school year 2015-16 juniors from Southern Aroostook and Katahdin. The program is a two year program where students take their academics one day and career and technical the next day. Students are able to earn college level credits will in this program. Next year a new cohort will be selected.

A selection process is underway and students will be notified soon of their status.

After School Program Update

Visiting Team

In addition the team may include other members of the Standards and Instructional Support Team, the Assessment and Accountability Team, the Special Services Team or School Improvement Specialists.

Who we need to speak with

High school teachers of all content areas

The district proficiency-based leadership team (and school board members for Extension Option 6 visitoptional during the first visit)

Please inform participants of each group the focus for our conversation in each session.

A – High school teachers – Teachers from all content areas should be represented Focus of Conversation: Understanding the relationship of curriculum, instruction, assessment and systems of support in a proficiency-based system

B – High school leaders – Must include the principal; other members could include other building administrators, teacher leaders, curriculum leaders

<u>Focus of Conversation</u>: Understanding school-based structures and culture that support teaching and learning

C -The proficiency-based district leadership team — Must include the superintendent; other members could include the members of the administrative team, and school board members (optional during the first visit)

<u>Focus of Conversation</u>: Understanding district-based structures, policies and culture that support proficiency-based education and community engagement

Proposed Schedule

The visit is built around three discussion sessions. The district may elect to arrange the conversations in the order that is most convenient and may adjust the session times within the scope of 2.75 hours (45-60 minutes per session). It is our experience that teacher groups benefit from additional time. Please allow for 10 minutes following the first two sessions and 20 minutes following the final session for the Maine DOE team to speak alone as a group.
